Prayer Breath Prayer



A short, ancient, contemplative prayer which is said by inhaling and exhaling for one breath. It often begins with a biblical name of God that is meaningful to you and followed with a word or phrase expressing your deep God-given hope or desire.

Step 1 | Find a guiet place.

Step 2 | Decide on a simple two part phrase to say silently or out loud.

• Jesus, Son of David...have mercy on me, a sinner

Abba, Father...I belong to you
Be still and know...that I am God

Not my will...but yours be done

Step 3 Practice the breath prayer, inhaling on the first part and exhaling as you say the second part, repeating the prayer for 2-5 minutes. For

Discern | Prayerfully discern the appetite that you will relinguish - a meal, social media, technology, etc.

Design | Make a plan for your fast - when, how long, people who need to know about it. etc.

Delight | Discern how you will actively turn toward God with joy and delight during your fast.



Passion That Teaches Matthew 21:1-19 | April 2

Journal it. Ask a friend. Discuss it in a group.

Reflect | Think about the last time you were either disappointed or surprised. What did you expect? What actually happened that led to your disappointment or surprise? How did you react?

Excavate | What is the significance of lesus riding in on a donkey (Zechariah 9)? What is the significance of palm branches?

Interpret | What kind of king are the people expecting? How are their expectations either surprised or disappointed? In what ways is Jesus' cursing of the fig tree a metaphor for Jesus' prophetic critique of the religious leaders?

Examine | Thinking back over your own life, how have God's ways and purposes surprised you (exceeded your expectations)? How have God's ways and purposes left you disappointed (shattered or changed your expectations)? How have both the surprises and disappointments brought about fruitfulness in your heart, life, and faith? What still feels barren, incomplete, or in need of God's healing and hope?

Apply | Jesus' cleansing of the Temple brings disappointment to some but healing to others. Where is God inviting you to relinquish expectations so that he can bring about healing in or through you this week?

Invite | When the opportunity arises, share the story of a time God surprised you or a time of God's transformation in a situation when your expectations weren't met with a family member, friend, colleague, or neighbor.
