



**Reflect** | What is one of the best wedding celebrations you have ever been invited to? What made it so special?

**Excavate** | Read Matthew 22:1-14. In this parable of the Wedding Banquet, what invitation does the king extend? Who refuses the king's invitation? Who accepts the invitation? What happens to the one who does not put on the wedding clothes provided by the king?

**Interpret** | What wedding is the king celebrating? Why is the king's invitation so extraordinary? Why don't the first list of guests pay attention? What do those who accept the invitation gain? Why does the one the king calls "friend" not put on the wedding clothes the king provides?

**Examine** | Why would those invited refuse this extraordinary invitation from their king—too busy, too rebellious, too apathetic, too careless? Thinking about your own life, what might cause you to refuse an extraordinary invitation from the King? What might compel you to accept?

**Apply** | In your Lenten preparation this week, what might God be inviting you to put off... and what particular practice of prayer, fasting, or mercy might God be inviting you to put on in its place?

**Invite** | Might you pray this week for an opportunity to share with someone what this season of Lent means to you personally? If so led, might you invite this person to a Lenten service, Community Night dinner, or a viewing of Fellowship's Lenten Art Gallery?
