Prayer



Praying Scripture is a practice that invites us to inhabit and authentically pray the prayers, psalms, teachings, and hopes found in the Bible.

Choose a verse, passage, or psalm that is particularly meaningful for you.

Connect

Settle into God's presence. Inhale God's love, grace, and mercy toward you. Exhale fears, doubts, and competing

Inhabit

Read and meditate on your selected passage, noticing how it comforts or challenges, helps you praise or lament, and ultimately points to God's redemption in your life.

Offer

Once the text becomes an authentic prayer from your own life, offer it back to God by reading it again. When you finish reading, simply close with "Amen."

Fasting

A Simple Practice for Fasting



Discern | Prayerfully discern the appetite that you will relinquish - a meal, social media, technology, etc.

Design I Make a plan for your fast - when, how long, people who need to know about it, etc.

Delight | Discern how you will actively turn toward God with joy and delight during your fast.

Mercy

Clothe The Naked

Bring a favorite (not least liked) article of clothing to service with you for a collective donation to Community Action House on Sunday, April 2.

- Donate clothing items or volunteer at Bibles for Mexico/Legacy Thrift (see Merle VanderSluis).



The Teacher Matthew 25:1-13 | March 19

Journal it. Ask a friend. Discuss it in a group.

Reflect | When you think of your calendar from week-to-week, what usually occupies your time and attention?

Excavate | What was the role of bridesmaids (and their torches) in first century Jewish wedding preparations?

Interpret | Why were the wise bridesmaids ready to meet the bridegroom? Why did the foolish bridesmaids not have oil for their lamps? What do the foolish bridesmaids miss out on?

Examine | Would you describe your life as more like the wise bridesmaids, the foolish bridesmaids, or a little bit of both? How do you know? What does an unprepared disciple miss out on?

Apply | Eugene Peterson suggests that "every time [Jesus] comes to us and we receive him, we are further and better prepared to meet him at his final coming—the arrival that will complete everything we understand as history" (*Conversations: The Message Bible*, pp. 1531-1532). Assuming that your own commitments and responsibilities won't change very much, what does it mean to live like a wise(r) disciple? What regular practice could you put on your calendar to keep Jesus in your thoughts so that you are always ready to receive him?

Invite | Who in your life seems overwhelmed or even burdened by the busyness of their lives? What are simple yet meaningful ways to help them encounter Jesus that meet them where they are in the busyness of their lives?
